2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-2019) Weekly Update #53 – December 3, 2020

CDC Changes to COVID-19 Quarantine and Isolation Time

- The incubation period of COVID-19 is between 2-14 days. While 14 days is the maximum incubation period for COVID-19, the median is about 5 days.
- On 12/2 the <u>CDC released new guidance with options to</u> <u>shorten the quarantine time.</u>
- Given substantial community spread of COVID-19 in NJ, the <u>NJDOH</u> continues to recommend 14 days *where feasible* to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19.
- Individuals that work or live in congregate settings that care for high risk individuals (long term care, assisted living facilities, etc) need to continue to quarantine for 14 days unless staffing shortages would cause risk to public safety.
- Outside of these high risk congregate settings if a 14 days quarantine is **not feasible**, the following options are acceptable alternatives:
 - Quarantine can end after Day 10 without testing **and** if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring.
 - When COVID-19 <u>testing resources are available</u>, persons exposed to COVID-19 should consider testing. Quarantine can end after Day 7 if the test result is negative **and** if no symptoms were reported during daily monitoring. The test specimen should be collected between Day 5 and Day 7, but quarantine cannot be discontinued earlier than Day 7. The person should **remain in quarantine** until the results are received and **are negative**. If the test result is delayed, quarantine should be continued until after Day 10.
- Quarantine can be shortened only if a person remains asymptomatic throughout the shortened quarantine period; if they continue to monitor for symptoms through Day 14; and if they are counseled to follow COVID-19 prevention recommendations.
- If persons under quarantine develop symptoms of COVID-19, they should immediately self-isolate and contact their healthcare provider.

NJ COVID-19 Updates

- On Nov 30th Governor Murphy signed <u>Executive</u> <u>Order 204</u> which pauses indoor practices and competitions for youth and adult sports from Saturday, December 5th through Saturday, January 2, 2021.
 - Private fitness classes, lessons and trainings at gyms, studios and similar locations are permitted to continue.
 - Collegiate and professional sporting activities will not be affected.
- Outdoor gatherings such as high school sporting events and outdoor concerts are limited to 25 individuals
 - Wedding ceremonies, funerals, memorial services and religious and political activities are not subject to the outdoor gathering limit.
 - Athletes, coaches, referees and other individuals necessary for a professional or collegiate sports competition are not counted towards the 25-person limit. Individuals not necessary for the sport including spectators DO count towards the 25-person limit.
 - Outdoor gatherings should continue to adhere to strict social distancing guidelines including the requirement to wear masks whenever it is not possible to social distance.
- Indoor meetings of addiction groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous are not limited to 10 individuals but will be limited to 25% capacity of the room in which they take place up to a maximum of 150 individuals.
