Updated NJDOH Guidance for COVID-19

COVID FAQ Corner

Q: I want the COVID-19 vaccine, but I was never enrolled in NJIIS. Will I still be able to get the vaccine?

A: Yes. When you go to receive the COVID-19 vaccine you will automatically be enrolled in NJIIS. I you do not want to be enrolled you will receive information about how to be unenrolled 30 days after the public health emergency expires.

Q: My child was exposed to a positive case in dance class. I want to discontinue their quarantine and return them to in-person school instruction after Day 7. Why can't I do this?

A: The new recommendation for discontinuing quarantine does allow for specimen collection and testing between Days 5 and 7, and if the test is negative you may discontinue quarantine after Day 7. However, when it comes to school many schools are choosing to continue with the recommended 14 days for the safety of students and school staff. Check with your district for more information.

Q: I still want to celebrate the winter holidays with my family. Is there a safe way to do that?

A: The safest way to celebrate winter holidays is to celebrate at home with the people who live with you. The CDC has <u>updated their guidance</u> to help individuals modify their holiday celebrations.

Mental Health, The Holidays and COVID-19



 - Somerset County Joint testing site with Hunterdon County at Raritan Valley Community College, 118 Lamington Road, Branchburg, NJ 08876. Drive thru testing by appointment only. The Dec 16th testing date has been moved to Dec 18th. The next test date is Wed, December 23rd from 10am-1pm. Subject to change. Check status of test site at http://www.co.somerset.nj.us/covid19status. Residents of Somerset County ONLY can make an appointment at https://somerset-hunterdon.adlabscovidtest.com/.
- Most doctor's offices, urgent cares and hospitals are testing symptomatic patients. If you are feeling unwell, call ahead to your healthcare provider. DO NOT just show up to an office, urgent care or ER.
